Indian Nettle. Plant Kingdom Euphorbiacae.

Clinical Application: Bloody expectorations. Coughs. Hemorrhages. Cancer. Tuberculosis

Sphere of Action: Alimentary Canal Respiratory organs

Core: All hemorrhages are aggravated in the morning

Symptoms:

- Hemorrhages from the lungs
- Rectal bleeding
- · Blood, dark
- · Cough dry, hard, followed by hemoptysis
- Spluttering diarrhea with forcible expulsion of noisy flatus
- Burning in intestines
- All hemorrhages have a morning aggravation

Banerji Protocol: Potency used is 6c.

Gastrointestinal Bleeding. 2nd Line of Treatment.

As this remedy is in the 2nd line of treatment, it is generally used only after the 1st line has been tried for a couple of months (in chronic conditions). For acute conditions it is to be started after a couple of days of using line 1 and can be taken every 3 hours.

Acalypha has bright red bleeding in the morning and dark and clotted bleeding in the afternoon. This could explain the tarred stools seen in this condition.
